- Completed audit of non-residential meters/accounts
- Paused meter replacement program in March, started back in the fall
- Completed replacement of 107 failed remote reading devices

- Gleneagles siphon maintenance manhole and valving
- Glenpatrick pressure reducing valve and vault installation
- Railway St. infrastructure upgrades and replacements
