
HOW TO USE A

Knowing the rules for roundabouts is the key for moving through them safely. As more roundabouts are used in our community (and around the province), it's important that we all do our part.



SINGLE LANE

ROUNDABOUT



Watch for the yellow roundabout sign. Slow down as you get closer.



Look out for pedestrians and cyclists.



You must yield to traffic already in the roundabout. Look left, then enter when there's a safe gap in traffic.

Drive counter-clockwise until you get to your exit. Signal right to exit. Watch for other vehicles and exit safely.

MULTI-LANE

ROUNDABOUT



Watch for the yellow roundabout sign and the white lane-choice sign. Slow down as you get closer.



Make sure you're in the correct lane before you enter the roundabout.



Look out for pedestrians and cyclists.



You must yield to traffic already in the roundabout. Look left, then enter when there's a safe gap in traffic.
