BE WINTER SAFE

No ice is safe ice. Frozen bodies of water are dangerous! Stay off all retention ponds, creeks and rivers as continuously changing water levels make the ice unstable and unsafe.

Be ice safe:

- Call 911 if you see someone on the ice.
 Don't put yourself at risk. Never go onto the ice to rescue people or pets. Call 911.
 Avoid frozen riverbanks as the water may be below the ice surface, causing you to slip and fall into the water.
 Never leave your child or pet unattended near icy bodies of water.
 The designated outdoor skating rinks are the Tim Bannister Memorial Outdoor Rink and Mitford Pond, which are maintained by the Town of Cochrane.
 Venturing onto frozen bodies of water puts your safety at risk. Stay off & stay safe!
