SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

CALGARY METROPOLITAN REGIONAL BOARD (CMRB) GROWTH PLAN

Administration presented a high level overview of the draft Calgary Metro Region Growth Plan and explored how it aligns with current Town planning documents.

The CMRB Growth Plan was developed around a set of overarching principles and goals based on environmentally responsible and sustainable growth management. These principles align with and complement Cochrane's strategic planning documents, including the Municipal Development Plan, Sustainability Plan, and Cochrane Community Vision.

Administration highlighted how these principles align with Cochrane's vision, values, and approach to sustainable growth management and development.

Administration supports the CMR Growth Plan and recommended Council support the approval of the Growth Plan by the CMRB and submission to the Minister of Municipal Affairs. CMRB Board members will vote on the plan on May 21.

Council endorsed Mayor Genung voting on behalf of the Town by a 5-2 vote.
