Childhood Development and Well-being Programs	These programs provide children with a strong early foundation. Utilizing play, they cultivate resilience, nurture positive relationships and enhance well-being, all while fostering the development of physical, cognitive and social-emotional skills. Developmental Screening	A screening tool that pinpoints developmental progress in children between the ages of one month to 5 ½ years. 57 questionnaires completed
Back to School Program	Ensures students K-12 have the necessary school supplies for success. 168 backpacks Supported 67 families 47% increase from 2022
Kiwanis Toy Project	A Christmas inspired event for children, ages 1-18, whose families are facing financial barriers. 200 children/youth 33% increase from 2022



Community Helpers Program	Community Helpers receive training to support the mental health of their peers, enhancing the overall community's mental well-being. Additional training includes Applied Suicide Intervention Skills (ASIST), Naloxone administration, Community Helpers Connections and Suicide Awareness Lunch and Learn sessions. 163 community helpers trained
Counselling Program	Family counselling offered to support families with children / youth. 42 hours of counselling service "My kids love Dylan. Thank you for this service. It has totally helped my family."
Back to School Event	In 2023, the Back to School event expanded into a half-day fair providing students and their parents with resources for a successful school year. 722 participants "Such a fun event and a great way for my kids to end summer holidays."

A range of strength-based, trauma informed programs and services are offered to build protective factors, increase knowledge and capacity to access resources, ensuring that residents have access to the support they require.

Caregiver Capacity Building Programs	Focus on strengthening parent knowledge and coping skills, through a variety of parent education sessions, home visitation service, peer support and social connection opportunities. 908 participants "The FRN helped my family during the most difficult time of our life. I am massively grateful for the programs. Thank you so much for all you do for me and my babies."
Rural Community Support Program	Provides essential assistance to rural residents by facilitating connections to critical resources, including food, housing, financial coaching and supportive counselling, as well as offering valuable information and referral services. 122 residents supported
Lending Library	This program provides access to a wide-ranging resource library, encompassing parenting books, resource boxes and a rich selection of children's literature. 160 items accessed
Cochrane Cares Mental Health Website	Launched during 2023 Mental Health Week, this site provides local information, resources and strategies to promote mental health. cochranecares.ca
Mental Health Week	We hosted our most successful Mental Health Awareness Week in 2023! The week offered a variety of programs ranging from drumming circles, art classes, free recreation at SLS to a self led meditative walk. All events were designed to promote mental wellness and share resources. 211 participants
Block Party Trailer	Block parties bring neighbourhoods together and help build community bonds. The Block Party Trailer provides everything needed to host a successful block party. 14 Block Parties held in 10 different neighbourhoods
Ukrainian New Year Celebration	To celebrate the arrival of Ukrainian evacuees, we hosted a Ukrainian New Year Celebration with traditional food and entertainment. 150 participants

poverty reduction programs

Providing a system of support to help residents achieve their social and economic potential.

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program	This program decreases poverty and increases economic self-sufficiency. 4 volunteers filed 651 tax returns. The program supported: → 113 children → 346 seniors → 44 Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH) → 253 low-income residents
Cochrane Connect Card	Provides low-income residents with access to multiple programs and services at a reduced rate. 335 Connect Cards issued 22 partners recognize the Connect Card 55% increase from 2022 "No judgment and incredibly kind and supportive staff. This town is so lucky to have each of them that I have
	come into contact with."
Food Security	Ensures no one in the community experiences hunger through a strategic partnership with The Cochrane Food Bank and Helping Hands Society. 1,989 food hampers distributed 555 families accessed food hampers 22% increase in hampers distributed from 2022 32 individuals accessed Meals for Your Freezer 1,137 meals/soups sold 416 emergency meals distributed
Instrumental Needs Program	Provides emergency funds for rent, utilities and basic needs. 18 individuals supported
Jacket Racket	A free annual event which aims to alleviate the costs associated with seasonal apparel by providing a selection of gently used winter wear for all ages. 306 adults and 245 children supported 72% increase from 2022





In the past 5 years Cochrane's senior population has increased by 172.4%, proving to be the fastest growing age population for our community. FCSS is focused on identifying and addressing priority issues senior residents are facing, through collaborative partnerships and capacity building initiatives.

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day	This media event, held at the Cochrane Community Health Centre, raised awareness of elder abuse and the community resources that are available.
Seniors' Week	Thanks to the hard work of community partners, 2023 Seniors' Week was the largest week yet! The week launched with a Grand Opening Ceremony of the Seniors on the Bow Labyrinth and included over 30 programs and events being offered throughout the week. See page 13

Emergency Preparedness for Seniors	Emergency preparedness week supported seniors to develop an emergency preparedness plan with emphasis on emotional wellness, personal strengths and social networks. 8 participants
Aging in Place	This program offered a wealth of resources and valuable information to assist seniors in navigating the various transitions that come with aging, enabling them to remain in their home or community as they age. 32 participants

Boost your Marvelous Brain	A session focused on increasing awareness around preventative factors and dementia. 53 participants



COMPASS for the Caregivers	This multi-session workshop, designed by Caregivers Alberta, supported caregivers and helps individuals balance their own wellness with the needs and demands of caring for a loved one. FCSS provides resources to the community and referrals to those in need of service. 11 caregivers supported "It was helpful knowing people are going through even tougher situations, receiving tools to be able to make it through everything that is thrown at me."

Dementia Series Workshops	A series of workshops to support caregivers and build resiliency. 33 participants
Fraud and Scam Prevention	This session was about recognizing fraud and scams, how seniors can protect themselves and who to reach out to for help. 56 participants
Seniors Property Tax Rebate Program	Assists eligible low-income seniors in Cochrane who own their property with a \$500 rebate on their property taxes. See page 13
Senior Benefit and Support Program	Assists seniors with applications to apply for federal, provincial and municipal benefits. 122 seniors supported 259% increase from 2022



community collaboration and committees



Cochrane FCSS provides leadership and support to develop and sustain collaborative tables that are working to effectively identify and address the complex, root causes of social issues in Cochrane and West Rocky View County. We provide mentorship, leadership training and workshops to support and build capacity in local non-profit organizations.

Child and Youth Forum	This forum improves awareness of services and collaborative efforts to support confident and resilient children, youth and families. Monthly meetings with a membership of 96 professionals
Child & Youth Case Collaboration Table	This group of professionals work collectively to address the complex needs of children, youth and their caregivers, in Cochrane and area. Bi-monthly meetings 15 cases brought to the table in 2023
Interagency	Monthly Interagency meetings foster organizational collaboration and unite social organizations to craft community-driven solutions for social issues. See page 17
Partners Sharing Space	FCSS provides office space for community partners, ensuring residents have seamless access to multiple social services. 7 partners share FCSS space
Community Space	Free meeting room space is provided to local community groups and partners to utilize. 26 groups utilized meeting rooms
Grant Writing Support	FCSS provides local organizations with assistance in grant writing and letters of support. 10 groups supported
Bragg Creek and Redwood Meadows Wellness Network	This local collaborative network fosters connection and supports activities in the rural area to promote community well-being. Monthly meetings with a membership of 44 professionals and residents



Food Connection Committee	This committee is working to create an accessible, affordable and sustainable food system in Cochrane and neighbouring areas. 4 new members Development of a food brochure and land acknowledgement statement Formalized Cochrane Farmers Market food recovery process
United Way of Calgary and Area Partnership	A formal partnership with the United Way of Calgary and Area helps to address the social needs of the community by funding local non-profit organizations.
FCSS Advisory Board	The FCSS Advisory Board has six community volunteers appointed by Town Council and one Council representative. The Board reviews and assesses the FCSS and United Way Partnership Grant Applications and makes recommendations for funding allocations to Cochrane Town Council. \$94,500 provided in grants Board Members: Councillor Alex Reed, Councillor Patrick Wilson, Diana Lowe, Gord Sarkissian, Kaitlin Chamberlain, Lisa Foster, Margaret Stevens, Theresa Bolton
Mental Health Committee	The Mental Health Committee was formed to develop a local community response to promote positive mental health. Initiatives include the creation of the new cochranecares.ca mental health website, that was launched during mental health week, 2023.
Board Governance	FCSS provides non-profit organizations with education, guidance, and support with grant writing, data collection, policies, procedures and safety.



seniors

FCSS is involved in several community development initiatives and collaborations to improve the well-being of older adults.

Seniors Advisory Committee (SAC)	FCSS leads the Seniors Advisory Committee which is focused on information sharing, advocacy and health promotion. SAC serves as a main connection for other senior committees and working groups. 34 members
Provincial Age-friendly Community of Practice (AFCOP)	AFCOP shares experiences, research and outcomes to identify and develop best practices to strengthen the individual and collective commitment to age-friendly practices and principles.
Dementia and Other Therapies and Services (DOTS) Committee	FCSS leads the DOTS Committee which supports older adults and caregivers. Accomplishments for 2023 include updating the "Cochrane and Area Older Adult Resource Booklet", attending a mock exercise with Search and Rescue around a missing older adult with dementia and continuing work to support older adults with dementia and their caregivers, removing shame and building resiliency through emergency preparation. 5 programs
Men's Shed Committee	The Men's Shed Committee supports the health and well-being of men in the community. 20 men contributed 170+ volunteer hours
Cochrane Older Adult Case Collaboration Table (COACCT)	COACCT is a group of professionals who work collectively to address the complex needs of seniors ages 65 and older in Cochrane and West Rocky View County. Monthly meetings with a membership of 18 professionals



Age-Friendly	The Age-Friendly Initiative, with financial support from the Calgary Foundation, aims to create an age- friendly community where there are no barriers to access services, programs, businesses and facilities. The project is being completed in two phases: community engagement and the development of a formal strategy. 2023 was focused on gathering community feedback.
Collaboration and Intercultural Support for Seniors	This program supports the Filipino community to build networks, access funding and collaborate on programming to strengthen intercultural relationships.
Grant, Sponsorship, Donations and Financial Support	These initiatives support multiple senior serving organizations with seeking grants and applying for funding. \$9500+ donated for Seniors' Week
Seniors on the Bow (SOTB) Partnership	FCSS works closely with Seniors on the Bow to strengthen the resouces and supports for older adults. In 2023, FCSS supported SOTB with program delivery, establishing community connections, funding applications, education and guidance, board governance and community engagement. Partnered for 4 awareness weeks/days, and 5 workshops
