

Cochrane is conducting a transit study to review the current COLT service, explore options to improve the service and make recommendations to Council in the fall of 2024. #### **Making Transit Sustainable**

The next few questions seek to understand how you believe transit service should be funded to ensure it is financially sustainable and appropriately scaled for Cochrane. Across Canada, public transportation is funded largely by local property taxes. Cochrane is no exception to this funding model. Cochrane currently spends 1.4% of its budget on public transportation services. This includes funding COLT and Rocky View Paratransit. The public transit budget represents approximately \$56 per year of property taxes on the average home in Cochrane, of which approximately \$41 per year funds the COLT service directly.
