Malann Klassen

is a multidisciplinary artist and educator and long-time Cochrane resident formally trained in drawing and ceramics at ACAD (AUArts). She often uses themes of home and belonging in her work. is a rural Cochrane-based artist and public art professional whose practice is driven by a fascination with connection—between people, environments, and ideas. With a BFA in sculpture and environmental studies from Mount Allison University and roots in both classical and contemporary traditions, Lara works across an array of materials including metal, clay, wood, and light. Her practice blends surrealism and realism, informed by early influence & mentorship from her sculptor uncle Mac Mackenzie (creator of Cochrane's "Man of Vision") and

shaped by years of hands-on public art installation and arts leadership. Lara's work invites curiosity, challenges perception, and encourages interaction—always anchored in her reverence for the land and her active role in Cochrane's creative ecosystem. As Founder and Executive Director of the Route 22 Artist Collective, Lara continues to weave art into the everyday experiences of her community and was a successful applicant for the Cochrane Crossing Civic Plaza Art Project.
