Water wisely

With the long weekend, you may be inspired to get outside, clean up your yard and prepare your lawn and garden for the season ahead. Cochrane's residential water use can rise by as much as 30% in the summer months, so when you turn on your outdoor taps, consider these tips on using less water outdoors.

• Avoid watering during the hottest parts of the day

Cochrane has Level one watering restrictions in effect year-round. Be sure you water before 10 a.m., or after 7 p.m.

- Prepare your soil for the dry summer
 Soil conditions vary widely in Cochrane. Local soils often need help from mulch, compost, conditioners (manure, sand, perlite, etc.), or aeration to grow plants more effectively
- **Try naturescaping** Conserve water through creative landscaping. Once established, a carefully and thoughtfully naturescaped area will be virtually maintenance free.

Horse Creek Sports Park Bylaw 11/2025

Cochrane Council proposes to pass a borrowing bylaw to finance construction of Horse Creek Sports Park project in the amount of \$11,430,000. The funding for this project will be \$600,000 from municipal reserves and \$10,830,000 from debt to be repaid over a period of 20 years.

The public may inspect the proposed bylaw at Legislative Services, Cochrane RancheHouse, Mon-Fri, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Electors may submit a separate petition with respect to the advertised bylaw calling for a vote of the electors to determine whether the proposed bylaw should be passed. The petition must meet the formal requirements of Sections 221-226 of the Municipal Government Act and be filed with the Director, Legislative Services within 15 days of the last date the proposed bylaw is advertised: May 29, 2025. Any petition is public information. This bylaw will be considered by Cochrane Council for Second and Third Reading at the Monday, June 9, 2025, Regular Council Meeting.
