Capital improvement projects 2025

Horse Creek Sports Park

A collaboration between Town of Cochrane and Rocky View Schools to build the vision of Horse Creek Sports Park and a future school site located immediately north of the community of Heritage Hills, creating a community sports activity hub for Cochrane, complete with outdoor sports amenities, pathways and gathering spaces.

The 2025 phase of the project includes site grading for the fields and servicing of the future school site.

Highway 1A/22 Interchange



The Province is widening Highway 1A to four lanes between Big Hill Creek and Highway 22, and upgrading the intersection at Highway 1A and Highway 22. These improvements will increase capacity, support current and future growth, enhance safety and improve pedestrian access.

Glenpatrick Drive infrastructure replacement



The Glenpatrick Drive project includes full replacement of underground utilities and road upgrades from 5th Ave to the intersection near Glenbow School. Improvements include road widening, new sidewalks and a traffic circle to enhance flow, safety and connectivity.

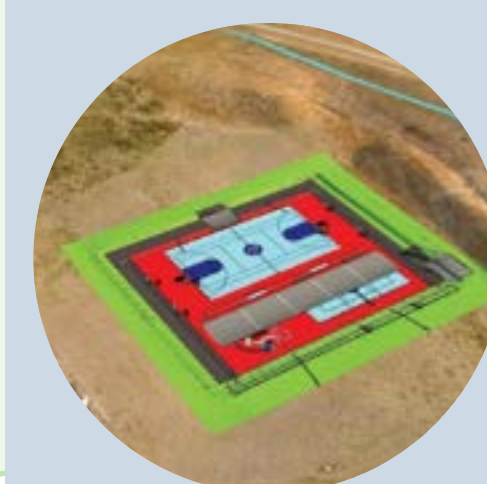
River Heights pump station and water storage expansion



This project will expand the potable water supply and storage capacity at the River Heights reservoir by adding two new concrete in-ground reservoir cells next to the existing one. A new stormwater pipe will also be installed along River Heights Drive to improve water management in the area.

James Walker Trail Stage 3



Stage 3 of James Walker Trail will extend the roadway 1.5 km to connect with Southbow, eventually reaching Hwy 22. The Town will build this section over two seasons (2025–2026), with Quilico completing the final 1 km.

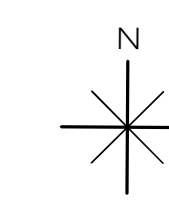
